What time is it for St. Francis Prayer Center?

In 2010 we began the search for a new director. It was a national search. Not just once or twice, but three times we searched. In the first two searches, the candidates ultimately chosen decided not to take the job – some for health issues; others just felt it wasn't the right call for them.

Our last search resulted in hiring Sr. Ruthann Williams, OP, from Caldwell, New Jersey. Unfortunately, it was not a good time for her since health issues forced her to relinquish her duties here after one year. We ask you to continue to pray for her needs at this time.

So, where do we go next? The Board needed prayer and guidance as, once again, they deliberated about the leadership of St. Francis Prayer Center.

What should the "Prayer Center" be? Do we even need a prayer center? What could a "prayer center" do that other agencies couldn't? We have agencies that help with food for those who are hungry, health care for those without insurance, pay for utilities when a person loses their job, and sometimes for temporary or permanent housing.

Where does a person go who is searching for "spiritual" guidance and nurturing? Would any of the above mentioned institutions provide that aspect? Is the spiritual health of a person any less important than food or rent? Some would say no. What do you say?

Let's take a trip back in time. Following is an excerpt from the History of the Prayer Center:

During the spring of 1973, after a profound religious experience of her own 30-day retreat, Sr. Joanne Chiaverini, I.H.M. began to sense a need and an urgent desire on the part of lay men and

women to grow in the "how-to's" of prayer. There was an attraction to the use of sacred scriptures in prayer and reflection; people were asking for "oasis spots" - places where they could find some silence and peace and for friends they could share faith with more personally. As she felt this need and shared this with friends, they encouraged her to begin. It was Sr. Joanne's conviction that the Prayer Center ought to be located where the poor could walk. A group gathered together in Sharon & John Ahearn's living room one evening, and prayed for wisdom and direction. This group became the first Prayer Center Team, and thus the seeds were planted.

Did you read that? ...an urgent desire on the part of lay men and women to grow in the "how-to's" of prayer. Has that changed? Is there no longer a need for this growth? How about "oasis spots"?

Have you been to the Prayer Center?

It takes you a step away from the hustle and bustle of our busy, sometimes mad, lifestyles. A quiet place. A place to contemplate, reflect and renew.

St. Francis Prayer Center can be a leader in the spiritual nurturing of people in this area. We've been through many trials and tribulations. And there may be more to come. But with the help of God, we will continue to grow and evolve – perhaps in ways we can't even imagine at the moment. God has plans for SFPC. Will you continue to be part of those plans? Is this the "time" for the spiritual health to grow in our area ... and in you?

"Who will I send?" We'll let our new director, Debra (Debbie) Hawley tell you about herself and her answer to that question...

... meet our new Director

Greetings, and Gods' Peace be with you. My name is Debra Hawley and I am honored and privileged to introduce myself as the new Director of St. Francis Prayer Center as of September 1st.

I may be familiar to some—as I have been in business as an interior designer in the Flint area for 30 years. My years of design business have taken me into the lives and homes of many beloved friends and clients from Florida and South Carolina to Traverse City and back to Flint.

I have been involved in many kinds of ministry in the last 25

years. From Baptism classes to organizing parish missions; from planning Healing Masses to more formational things like 7-week "Life in the Spirit" Seminars. In 1985 while at Mass one Sunday, I had a rather profound experience of God. One of the songs at communion time was "Here I Am Lord." I felt a definitive call on my life that day. New at such revelations, I smiled and took it in stride when I heard the words, "I have heard my people's cry ... who will I send?" "Here I am Lord," I heard myself respond internally—"I will go if you lead me." Knowing that I had 2 sons to raise and a thriving business, I had

no idea what had just occurred. I had no idea of the 'yes' I had spoken to God in my heart that day!

The following 25 years were fast and often hard. I thought the Romans 5:1-5 verses about adversity and endurance were written just for me. I continued to further my own growth by attending leadership conferences and evangelism courses and classes on how to teach Spirit filled Catholic Living. Before long my Pastor began to send people for Spiritual Direction my way and my life had begun a big turn about. Often, the words of Jeremiah 29:11-14 followed me like the hound-dog of heaven. "For I know the plans I have for you...."

In the year of the Jubilee 2000, I began to earnestly ask the Lord to find a place for me 'full time' in His service. By this time I had made many friends in the church, both lay and clergy, and many knew that God had a call for me ... but we were all waiting—and praying—for it to be made manifest and evident to Debbie's heart.

For all that Romans 5 had taught me, I had come to realize the surgery that was being performed on my soul was by "the Divine Physician," and the healing that was taking place was from the Holy One who is Healer for us all—Jesus. I was being prepared for that 'yes' I had spoken. It wasn't always easy—or pretty.

Unless we are willing to be pruned—sometimes, severely, and polished over and over again until transparent—we will be only partially available to our God.

Only to the measure of our obedience will we see or hear or recognize Gods' call or direction or answer to our prayers. Much like trying to see through a very dirty window—the dirt; dust, pride, woundedness and fear will cloud our vision and block our ears from hearing the Voice of The One Who Loves us Best.

These many years of differing service for Gods' People, have ministered to me as well in a very deep way. Those who have so little are often those most generous with what they have. Those who seek direction and guidance are willing to be transparent too and welcome someone who is also a sinner and looking for their way (me) to help guide and direct them, and has faith that God has placed them there as a companion.

We are a Pilgrim People. As Gods' People we are not known because we are Catholic or Baptist or African American or white or socially well thought of or poor beyond understanding. We are known because we are all loved first by Him Who Loves us Best. He is no minder of persons. When we are truly authentic, we are in right relationship with Him. Then, and only then, do we have what it takes to be in right relationship with others, and can also be good companions for our brothers and sisters.

I am in awe at the wonderful mission and accomplishments that St. Francis Prayer Center has provided both to the community and to its' fellow man. It is with a most humble heart I accept the opportunity to serve you. Please pray for me often as I discern the Holy Spirit's direction for the Prayer Center. I am looking so forward to meeting you all and hearing your stories.

A Recipe to Delight Your Taste Buds

Pumpkin Cake Ingredients

1 lb. canned pumpkin (mix w/spices in it)

1/2 cup sugar

12 oz. Pet evaporated milk 3/4 tsp. of cinnamon

3 eggs

1 box yellow cake mix

2 sticks of margarine (I use butter)

1-1/2 cups chopped pecans

1/2 cup brown sugar

Topping: 8 oz. cream cheese, 1/2 cup powdered sugar, as much Cool Whip as necessary to make it easily spreadable for the top.

Pumpkin Cake Directions

Line a 9x13 pan with wax paper. Mix pumpkin, sugar, milk, eggs, and cinnamon. Pour onto wax paper. Prepare cake mix according to directions and pour over top of pumpkin mixture; mix pecans and brown sugar and pat on top.

Bake at 350°F until knife comes out clean, approximately 25-30 minutes.

Before it gets too cool, flip over leaving pecan mixture as top.

Add topping.
