Notice, *in the front page photo*, the delicate ice covered branches are not scorched or damaged by His burning Light. Sound familiar? We are like those ice covered branches. We are delicate, frozen in our pain and isolated in our fears. We fear we cannot be holy enough to reach the mark of the Royal Priesthood that we have been called to, by God. However, in His Mercy, He restores us back to wholeness—without injury to those fragile branches that hold our deepest fears and hurts. Although they contain our woundedness, they *still* glisten like diamond insulators holding us captive until they are healed.

Isaiah says it beautifully in 58:8-9. "Then your light shall break through like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then, you shall call and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, here I am. If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom will be like noon day."

Holy Spirit, help us make this a "good Lent." Indeed, as we feed the poor, fast and find our way to reconciliation, let the mercies of Our Lord Jesus restore us completely. Let the blinding Light of your countenance examine and probe us. Let us not be fearful of the 'thaw' as Your love surrounds and

restores us to the dignity of your workmanship, for we are fearfully and wonderfully made in Your image.

The Windows of Our Heart - A Windex® Moment

We have all seen the result of using Windex on a window or mirror. When the surface is cloudy or obscure we are prohibited from seeing clearly in either direction. At the very least it is annoying to not see what is really there.

In our spiritual life how can this be applied? Only in complete authenticity can we really be free to accept God's love in its fullness or for that matter the love of someone else either. When we permit our heart to stay clouded and obscure we are not being truthful and authentic. Even if we clean the inside (partial obedience) we can still hide from those wishing to 'see in.' Either way, when we are not transparent and 'Windex clean' we hold onto practices and behaviors and ways of thinking that are injurious to ourselves and to others. It permits us to still hide from the truth. More important than just annoying us, the scriptures and church traditions teach us to confess, repent, and to search our hearts for the truth. During this season we have multitudes across the country going through what the church calls 'scrutinies.' How often have we 'scrutinized' ourselves and our behaviors? It is very convenient to hide behind the dirty window and not

allow anyone to see in.
The irony is, what we use to hide behind may be our religion, our job, our position or vocation or our education. When we are 'Windex clean' before



the Lord, it allows us to see not only our sins, but what great new thing God has for us! It spotlights the path He wishes us to take and predisposes us to stay on course. The clear heart is authentic with the Lord and with others. In the honesty, we are the recipients of His Grace and Mercy—and it gives us *Eyes to See*, and a *Heart to Follow*. This life to the full is not possible with partial obedience and a cloudy and obscured heart.

Let us ALL RISE with Him at the Resurrection this Easter season with a clean heart and a 'clear view' of where He is directing us in our lives. Let us ALL take the steps to be 'Windex clean' before our Lord Jesus.

May your Easter Season be filled with God's Mercy and a clear view of the path He has for you. *In the Power of the Holy Spirit, Debbie*
