If we are watchful and stay awake to what God has for us, we are being intentionally mindful of Him and what He is saying to us—we are in relationship with Him. It is then that the actions we take are driven

When the gifts have been used for this purpose and His power is manifested we see the fruits. When John exclaimed "Repent, and prepare a way for the Lord," he was issuing a call for conversion from them—a change of heart, a change of the way they were living. This is alert and watchful living, and it is birthed out of a relationship, with the one true God,

Ra's Best Carrot Cake

3 cups flour 2 cups sugar

11/4 cups of corn oil 2 teaspoons vanilla

1 cup coconut 1 teaspoon grated orange peel

2½ teaspoons baking soda 3 egg 1 teaspoon salt 11 oz

11 oz can mandarin oranges w/juice

3 cups of shredded carrots 11/4 cup of corn oil

Mix well and bake at 350 degrees 45-55 minutes. Frost with a generous portion of your favorite cream cheese frosting. Garnish: with sprigs of finely shaved carrot or sprinkle of coconut.
