See I am doing a new thing. Now, it springs up, do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

Spring is on its way--finally! What a long and snow filled season we have had. Under the leaves and brush I actually saw little nubs of tiny green buds in some of the early flowers. I hope they will stay low profile for a bit, as 40 degrees and sun today is moving back to snow tomorrow.

First, let me apologize for the lengthy time between newsletters.

Our daily activities have easily doubled or perhaps even more, since the first of September. We began the fall like a power surge happened. We came into the Center each day in mid-September and found our porch filled with people waiting for our doors to open.

By the end of October we had depleted every single thing we had in the whole building to give away. All cupboards of food; of paper products; of soaps/detergents; of personal care items and every package of meat in the freezers were emptied. I was overwhelmed, and worried, really worried.

Isaiah's words in 43 speak of God making a way in a wasteland or wilderness. Flint has changed remarkably in the last 20 years and some (especially those looking from the outside) might view Flint as a wasteland or wilderness. No one would argue. We sure do have our challenges! So, we are following this 'new way,' trusting that God is directing it, and that it will be fruitful if it is His plan for us, and I am becoming a rather proficient 'beggar.' We have some very difficult days here, but we have other days when a young mother calls and reports she is going to keep her baby after visiting with us and receiving the prayer we offered.

As this surge descended upon us, some changes were made to accommodate the need. A previous retreatant working on her masters, drove 2 hours each way to volunteer in our now burgeoning outreach. Kathy, a previous educator, the wife of our mainte-



nance man, Dick, also came on board a few days a week to do intake and manage the multitudes of beds and blankets and food, we were now providing.

Someone suggested putting an ad in the local Catholic churches about the things we needed. I had never done that, but was desperate to find a solution to help all those the Lord had sent us.

Several things occurred. Many individuals stopped by our Center or called us to drop off items that we needed. Most had never heard of the St. Francis Prayer Center! They were so excited to help us. I was moved beyond tears—day after day.

St. John, Fenton rose to the occasion in a huge way. St. Francis Prayer Center has been doing different seminars and bible studies for them during the last 3 years. I have been in and out of that parish regularly. We have made many friends there who have begun to be a part of our 'family' at the Center. Dcn. Terry and Melanie at the desk, said, "Come out here to our outreach center, Debbie. Send your guys with the van. We will help you." I had no idea!!

Three hours later, the guys were back. It took 3 more hours to unload, unpack, and store the groceries, meat, and other supplies. St. John's literally set us back on our feet, and permitted us to continue to take care of the multitudes that needed help.

Thank God for **St. John, Fenton**, and for all those who answered the call to help us. So many of you are praying and answering our call for help here. We are so grateful, the young families we serve, are so grateful.

There is indeed something new going on here, and no, we didn't quite perceive it, Lord, but we are trusting in you completely.

We are walking the walk Lord, as best we can—keeping our eyes fixed on you.

My heart sank as I realized we had hundreds of gifts in the building awaiting our big Christmas Adoption party 2 weeks later. The van that we delivered all the beds for kids was taken. Our snow blower, leaf blower, power washer, chainsaws and all big tools that we use to maintain the property—all gone. The alarm system was ripped out of the walls. I was so angry, and then immediately—so discouraged. I begged Jesus to help me not be so angry, and to please just help us do what he had asked us to do "feed my people."

nity to let the community know our struggle. So close to Christmas and so much work to do and snow to plow ... it was hard to be authentic



and still allow our witness for Christ be visible. Deb did publicly forgive the thieves but added she was very discouraged, as we had many beds promised for children before Christmas.

Mark Bullion, from TV12, came back the day of our party and interviewed adoptees and those who had been adopted. It was a great piece showing how God had a Silver Lining in mind for St. Francis.

A local U-Haul donated a truck for the beds promised before Christmas. The blue van was a surprise that hadn't come yet!

One week later: Angels Drive Blue Vans

A visitor rang the bell. "Is that lady here that was on the news?" I said, "Yes, that's me. How can I help you?" He said, "I'm Karl, this is my son. My wife Kathy and I saw the news. We are from



Owosso. I brought you a van. We would like you to have it. It's a bit rough looking, but only has 40,000 miles. Will that help you? Speechless, but with crocodile tears running down my cheeks, I muttered something, and nodded my head. He and his son gave me a giant Oreo hug and handed me the title.

Yep, think that was an Angel alright.

10 days to the party ... tons of snow coming, no snow blower. Oh my, what will we do?

A short time later, a visitor rang the bell. "Is that lady here that was on the news? No, Jean says." May I help you?" "Well uhh, ... here (he opens his wallet and thrusts a wad of dollars into her hand then asks), "You going to be here awhile?" "Yes, 'til 4:00," she says. Two hours later he came back with a brand new snow blower with the tags still hanging on it!

Yep, I guess Angels not only drive blue vans but come bearing snow blowers too!

OUTREACH NEWS

We still need someone who would volunteer a few hours a week to monitor our pantry and shop for it. Because of the huge increase in people we help, it has become a vital piece of our work here.

All kinds of food: meats, paper products, laundry/dish soaps, shampoos, and personal hygiene

items are in constant need.

Beds: we are quite likely the only place left who will provide mattresses. It is a very persnickety thing to accomplish which is why most do not do this anymore! In the last 90 days we placed 26 children in a bed who were sleeping on the floor. We currently have a waiting list of 18. This is a critical need.

They must be free of stains, but gently used is always fine. We accept (when the need is there) sofas, chairs, and small tables, dishes, silverware, glasses, pots & pans, blankets, sheets.

brochures for the Fundraiser as well as many other tasks.



Loves You Best," the one who gave His life for yours. I pray that this 'knowing' will be your own personal encounter




cause in knowing Him (experiencing personally), you will also know your Father.




Give the Gift of Prayer
