Meetings, Fundraiser meetings, as well as Bible classes. Church was cancelled so we had to watch videos of Sunday Masses or church worship services. We found ourselves struggling to "keep in touch" with our current setups.

Food Pantry Remained Open

The Food Pantry Outreach pushed through like a bull dozer as multitudes came through SFPC that had never before been here. Even though the food bank restricted us (as a smaller outreach) many wonderful people brought food and supplies by the carload to us. Director Deb was ecstatic to have the extra as our numbers quadrupled for a time, and our resources were reduced! God is always mindful, and knows the needs of his people.

Bed Deliveries Halted for A Time

Bed deliveries halted for several weeks while Covid was so brand new, we had almost caught up and beginning to 'breathe' a bit when it hit. So, backed us up again another $2^{1}/_{2}$ months for deliveries. We did start back significantly earlier than anyone in the city, however. Still, at this time, many organizations are not up and running a normal schedule. This means not only deliveries not done, but nothing taken in like bed-

ding either. SFPC jumped back into action, albeit with all precautions taken and began to serve people again. We are in full production again, but are only permitted to bring things to our client's porch or driveway.



We are still in need of bedding and dressers. Both children and adults have been sleeping on the floor. Sometimes when they leave a difficult situation, they cannot take all of their items with them. That isn't something you and I have to think about. Remember these words...

'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.' MATTHEW 25:40 NIV

Each call, I personally spoke and prayed for people individually. Some struggled with fear, others with cancer, others with a pregnancy delivery expected in Covid time, still others with chronic disease, no bed and on the floor!

The Holy Spirit knew that 'I' needed to know these things to intercede for them specifically. I was humbled beyond belief to pray for them and share their heartaches.

The final chapter in this particular story is the spectacular heart of the Bed Boys, our wonderful team of so many volunteers and staff here. A very special thanks to the delivery guys, who became 'food delivery' guys during this time. This means ALL OVER THE CITY.

If they couldn't deliver beds—God would have them deliver food/personals, and thanks to Robin, it was so easy to do by zip code! Totally a God Thing. See what the word of God says about teamwork.

FOOD PANTRY – A Journey in Process

Have you ever wondered what the whole process is for running a food pantry?

• Food Bank of Eastern Michigan (FBEM) is contacted and given our order.

- Food is picked up by volunteers, put on shelves.
- Various volunteers pack Family food boxes.

• Clients check in & are given food, paper products, cleaning supplies, and personal care items as needed.

What initially began as a very limited pantry – one that could give a small amount of emergency food to families, grew ...and grew ...and grew. We now have a large room dedicated to the Food Pantry. Shelves were added to hold the abundance of items, both purchased and donated.

Also, we were gifted 2 refrigerators w/freezers, and 2 Large freezers, and 1 small. With a complete pantry, and these added, we are a full service pantry.

Riverside Tabernacle recently heard of our Pantry and Outreach program and offered to 'fill in the gap' for us each week. The fresh food has been eliminated



for us temporarily because of Covid, so they stepped in to help us.

Many thanks, and God's blessings to our newest helper in serving God's people.
