Joy in OBEDIENCE

Often, we find joy in the most unexpected places!
Certainly, we expect to

experience joy at specific events and in celebration of achievements and milestones.

Many years ago, I taught baptism classes and routinely worked with the young married couples and their sponsors. It was a joy for me to do, and I loved the opportunity to love on those babies, while evangelizing their parents and family members.

Funny, how certain subjects and topics can sway a good natured crowd into a tentative and nervous group! Enter the word 'obedience.'

I spoke frankly about having the children baptized, but *not* continuing to bring them to church. I encouraged them by reminding them that they, too, were children of God the Father and that their identity as a son or daughter of God is what defined them — not their job or status in the business world.

By reminding them how much they were loved, even now as grown adults, and that regardless of where they'd been or what they had done — practiced or not practiced their faith — that they got a different opportunity with this little child's baptism. Here was an opportunity for them to make a *choice* to be obedient to what life and faith God had called them to. It offered to them a 'new turn' to be obedient.

As parents we expect (and hope)

Though you have not seen Him, you love Him; and even though you do not see Him now, you believe in Him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls. 1 Peter 1:8-9

that our children will be obedient to us. If our hearts are in right order, it will not be to lord over them our 'parental position,' but to love and protect them in the make for their lives. CCC 2228

Should we as adults be any less obedient to the God who created us?

When the angel Gabriel announced to Mary she was carrying the Christ Child Jesus, her 'Fiat,' or yes, was immediate, "I am the Lord's servant, be it done to me according to his will." (Luke 1:38) This complete submission to God is a profound model for us today, as it has been and will be in all ages. Except, in the Power of the Holy Spirit, it would not be possible to do such a thing!

What JOY the whole world would experience for all of time, with one woman's 'yes' to God! She sets the standard for the rest of the world to follow in what it really means to be obedient. Only in Truth and Love and in great Power can we emulate her obedience.

I am humbled beyond measure each day I serve this Prayer Center, and am reminded often by the Lord, that I didn't ask for this particular job, but that He, in His wisdom, placed me here. He reminds me that I said "yes." He also reminds me that the Center and its people do not belong to me. They belong to Him.

As we travel through Lent and the Passion of Jesus, may we keep the 'yes' of the Son of God, to His Father, first and foremost in our hearts and minds.

His yes, included a death by crucifixion, and heartache for those He loved who also betrayed him.

But, the wisdom of the Father knew well the JOY that would come from his 'obedience.'


He knew well the sacrifice would yield *Unspeakable Joy*, as His children would be with him in eternity as a result of the obedience of his son Jesus.

A few years ago, I asked Debbie about the annual Christmas Party at St Francis and stating that shopping wasn't my strong suit maybe there was another way I could help. She mentioned that she could use someone to take over the luncheon. Right away, not knowing any details, I gave her an enthusiastic yes!

I had worked part-time through St John Vianney and Powers Catholic serving food and drinks to many for various functions. A couple of weeks later, Deb and I discussed the party and I discovered that we were talking about 150 or so people. I tried not to panic and called my Mom like any girl in trouble would do and she calmed me down so we could make a plan. I am pretty sure she started making her famous meatballs that afternoon. I was sure my friends would like to help but wisely they just started throwing money at me instead! I have had generous help from friends and coworkers the past 3 years, every little bit helps.

After making way too much food the first year, we have since perfected our menu. My mother, **Yvonne Stevenson**, starts making and freezing 400 meatballs in October. Lunch also includes: Sloppy Joes, mac & cheese or cheesy potatoes, hot dogs, veggies, potato



chips, bread and butter pickles, and baked beans. Plus all the extra fixings such as buns and condiments.
