

## Ministry Outreach



There are a number of ways you can join **St. Francis Prayer Center** in helping others. Here are a few suggestions:

✚ **Bed Ministry.** Did you know there are families in our area living in apartments or houses without beds? Our bed ministry started with Beds-for-Babies (*and we still do that*), but now we are helping the whole family with beds. We take donations of gently-used twin, twin XL, full, & queen, as well as frames, dressers, & gently used bedding.

✚ **Food pantry.** We can always use paper products, personal care items, cleaning supplies (laundry & dish soap, bleach or other cleaning solutions, garbage bags. People can visit us once a month for emergency food and other items.

✚ **Consumers Energy help.** Although the rules change periodically, we continue to help where we can through St. Vincent de Paul-Detroit.



✚ **Adopt-A-Family** for Thanksgiving. You can shop for a particular family size or just make a donation of food from our list, a turkey or of money.\*

✚ **Adopt-A-Family** for Christmas. You may choose to provide just gifts, or food/food card. Family sizes range from 1 to 8. We choose to do gifts for the whole family. Suggested amount \$50-\$75 per person.\*

*\*Two or more people or groups can go together to sponsor a family.*

Any donation would be considered a gift from God. Those smaller amounts add up. We have many monthly pledgers who send small amounts. Over the years, those pledges have kept the Prayer Center going.

Roads and sidewalks were slippery and covered with ice which made the sacrifice of our dedicated delivery guys, very real. Many are retirement age guys with a heart for children and the poor. God Bless them.

Most of those getting this newsletter don't really 'see' the poorest we have with us in Flint. Frankly, until my work here began, I didn't either.



It's one thing to read about or see on the news, but quite another to meet these folks and their children, pray with the moms, and see with your own eyes the poverty they live with on a daily basis; to understand, most do not have the basics just to live—not to mention with any sort of dignity! Many give blood at plasma places just to survive.

As church people, we understand the meaning of 'parish' as our own community at our own respective church. But, in reality, it is a geographical district. So, too, the very poor as they live among us in the abandoned houses; the subsidized apartments; and on the streets are 'our parish people' too.

Please understand, you likely pass some these people of God every day as you go to work or church.

The Prayer Center is a vital source for countless people who cannot find help anywhere else. The **Love of Jesus** compels us to be a beacon of hope for the 'least of them.' Matthew 25:45 "I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers, you did it for me."
