EXAMPLE Coming Home... Living in the Father's Love

In prayer this morning I hear the words "are you a Pentecost people?" I ask the Lord, "what does this mean?" He replies, "how does a child typically react to their birthday? Are they full of new expectations of gifts and visits from family members and friends that will come and visit and share time with them?"

"Are they full of joy?"

Slowly, I began to see His picture for me in this answer. We hear that Pentecost is the birthday of the church. It is a solemn and exuberant day, filled with new hope for the upcoming year.

Clearly, many have been caught in a cycle or rut as they moved through the pandemic, and sadly, many more have lost their homes, businesses and livelihoods.

But Romans 5:5 and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us.

So, I took two important takeaway's from our heart to heart this morning:

Firstly, a Pentecost people are full of joy and hope and expectations that the Father has a plan for us

(Jeremiah 20:11) "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for prosperity and not disaster, to give you a future and a hope."

Being a Pentecost people does not mean we will not suffer hardship, but it does mean we will trust our heavenly Father and Jesus (our hope) and put ourselves 'intentionally' under the Power of the Holy Spirit, by accepting the Lordship of Jesus. And boy does He have gifts for us!

We are His children. Children depend on their fathers, believe in them, and are excited to spend time and play and share life with them. Children 'expect' great things from their father who loves them and live out this life with/for them.

Secondly, we all know that this example and desire is not true for many—maybe even us! Certainly not for the hundreds and hundreds that the Prayer Center serves. Sadly, it is not their experience. While both of those statements may be true, it does not negate the truth of the Gospel. It rather, gives us all a reality check!

So, we pray:

Father, we desire to be a Pentecost People; we desire to be 'childlike' in our relationship with you; we desire to be filled with hope and expectation; we ask you to help us be mindful of not 'who we are,' but 'whose' we are! We are children of the King. Help us live like that.

Jesus, help us to yield to your Lordship, to be OK with letting you be 'the Boss of us.'


